LESSON AT A GLANCE

WONDER TRUTH: The Holy Spirit Gives Us Power

SCRIPTURE: [Acts 13](#)

WORD OF WONDER: [From Romans 12:2](#)

As you flip through the pages of God’s Word, you are likely filled with awe at the amazing things God does. He spoke the universe into existence. He made a donkey talk, destroyed cities with fire from heaven, and made the sun stand still for an entire day. Then we read about all the times God’s power was displayed through others. Demons were cast out, the lame were healed, the dead were raised to life ... all from mere humans in the name of Jesus.

Living in the twenty-first century, we can forget that miracles still happen. God’s power isn’t just limited to Bible times. Take some time to read [Acts 13:1–12](#). DID YOU KNOW?

FOUNDATION BUILDING BLOCKS

WHO?

In [Acts 13:9](#), Luke first tells us that Saul was also called Paul. Jews could be given an alternative Roman name at birth, and Paul became the preferred name when traveling outside Jewish circles. The name has nothing to do with his following Jesus.

WHAT?

“Blindness” almost always has a metaphorical meaning in the Gospels and Acts. The magician Elymas had the role of advisor, but he was leading the proconsul astray as a false prophet. Thus he becomes temporarily blind and has to himself be led ([Acts 13:11](#)).

WHERE?

The island of Cyprus is in the Mediterranean Sea, and it was known to have a prominent Jewish community. [Acts 4:36](#) tells us that Barnabas is from Cyprus, and his connections may have been the reason for the missionaries to travel there.

WHEN?

Sergius Paulus governed Cyprus around 45–46 AD. He was a Roman senator, and Luke gives the accurate name for this proconsul.

CONNECTING TO GOD’S BIG STORY

God commanded His people to test prophets for falsity ([Deuteronomy 18:20–22](#)). Similar cautions are found in [1 John 4:1–3](#). No one who denies that Jesus came as God “in the flesh” speaks for God, and only the Spirit of God speaks for God.

Spark curiosity, encourage exploration, and get kids thinking about the wonder of God.

LESSON AT A GLANCE

WONDER TRUTH: The Holy Spirit Gives Us Power

SCRIPTURE: Acts 13

WORD OF WONDER: From Romans 12:2

Curiosity Activity: Power On, Power Off

SUPPLIES: flashlight

Greet the kids warmly and welcome them to church.

Welcome! I am so happy you're here!

Gather the kids together and show them a flashlight.

Today, we're going to learn about power. Hold up the flashlight. I have a flashlight. Batteries give the flashlight power.

Turn the flashlight on and off several times while saying "on" and "off" each time. Encourage the kids to repeat after you and say "on" and "off."

Batteries give the flashlight power to turn on so it can shine brightly! God gives us power through the Holy Spirit!

Leader Tip: If you can't darken the room, you can use a battery operated toy that plays music or moves, and turn it on and off to show power.

Prayer of Invitation

Before entering into God's big story, lead kids in a prayer of invitation. Use the prayer here or your own words: **God, thank You for this time to study Your Word and learn more about You. We invite the Holy Spirit to lead us and fill us with power so we can share the love of Jesus with others. In Jesus' name, Amen.**

God's Big Story

Pull out the Bible.

Ask: What is this called? *The Bible*

Ask: Why is the Bible important? *Because it is God's word. Everything in it is true. It really happened.*

Create space for God to remind kids they are known, loved, led, and their lives can tell of God's wonder.

Prayer and Blessing

After the kids finish their activity, pray with them, thanking God for giving us power.

God, thank You that when we trust in You, You give us the Holy Spirit. We are thankful that You make us strong and give us power. We love You, God. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Encourage the kids to hold their hands out in front of them, with palms up, as if their hands were open to receive something. Tell them to listen and receive the blessing as you speak it over them.

Blessing: May God give you power as you ask the Holy Spirit to work in you and transform you. May the power He gives you help you follow Jesus all your days! Go in the strength and courage that comes from God.

Closing Activity: Boat Ride

SUPPLIES: blanket or towel, toy or paper fish (optional)

Lay a blanket (or towel) on the floor. Place pretend fish on the floor around the room (optional).

Paul and Barnabas rode in a boat to go tell people about Jesus! Let's pretend to ride in a boat like Paul and Barnabas did!

Invite kids to sit on the blanket and pretend that the blanket is a boat. Show the kids how to pretend to row the boat. Use your imagination and look for fish and other water animals as you "travel."
